Thursday, June 5

Depart Dallas/Ft. Worth International Airport to Munich, Germany.

Friday, June 6

Arrive in Munich, the center of southern Germany. The luxury bus, including your English-speaking tour guide, will be waiting for you at the airport and will transport you to the historic center of Munich, the capital of Bavaria and the core of cultural and economic activity in southern Germany. Munich is one of Germany's most attractive cities, which has been made famous by its annual beer festival, Oktoberfest. We will have lunch at the famous porter house, Hofbrauhaus, established in 1589. Every day 17,500 pints of beer are served in 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ pint tankards. There is a generous pub buffet that features an array of Bavarian specialties.

In the afternoon, we will take a guided walking tour of Munich, where we will see the main Marienplatz with a new town hall built in the neo-Gothic style. We will also visit the Church of Our Lady, the vast late Gothic hall-church which has become the symbol of the city.

We will depart Munich for Nuremberg and check-in at the hotel. Leisure time before our first group dinner.

Saturday, June 7

In the morning, we will have a sightseeing tour of the modern part of Nuremberg, the Nazi center, and the judicial building where trials of WWII war criminals took place. We will also view the unfinished Coliseum Hitler ordered to be built as a grandiose copy of the Coliseum in Rome and Zeppelin Field where all the parades took place. We will round out our tour of Nuremberg in the medieval part of the city where we will see the ancient castle overlooking the city, the Church of Our Lady on the main market square, and other points of interest.

In the early afternoon, we will depart for the famous spa town of Karlovy Vary in the Czech Republic and check into the hotel. Karlovy Vary is the largest spa town in the Czech Republic, owing its international fame to its natural mineral springs. We will have a short tour of the promenade, then you may enjoy the sights and sounds of this beautiful town. You may also opt to shop in many of the quaint shops, which sell Bohemian crystal, garnet and amber jewelry, and antiques.

In the evening, we will dine at a local Czech Restaurant.

Sunday, June 8

Attend early Mass at St. Mary Magdalene Church or spend time shopping in Karlovy Vary. Depart for Prague, the capital of the Czech Republic, and check in at the hotel. In the evening, we will take a 2-hour dinner cruise on the Vltava River where you can see the sights of Prague beautifully illuminated at night!

Monday, June 9

In the morning, we will have a guided walking tour of Prague beginning with Prague Castle and then on to St. Vitus Cathedral, Hradcany quarter, and the Church of Our Lady Victorious which houses the famous wax statue of the Infant Jesus of Prague. We will walk across the famous 14th century Charles Bridge and continue on to Old Town Square to see the Astronomical clock. After lunch, we will end the tour at Wenceslas Square, which has historically been the sight of many events including the 1989 Velvet Revolution demonstrations. You will have free time for individual sightseeing and great shopping at the numerous stores lining the square. In the evening, we will be treated to dinner and a Czech music and folklore show.

Tuesday, June 10

Leisure morning for sightseeing or shopping in Prague. We will head east toward the picturesque rolling hills of Moravia, where our ultimate destination will be the town of Buchlovice. We will check in at the hotel, rest, and finish the day with an enjoyable evening party at Koliba Vlcina complete with Moravian wine, music and grilled chicken.

Wednesday, June 11

Depart to the glassworks in Kvetna where you can see the production of glass right in front of the furnace and witness the precise work of the skilled glassmakers. There will be a chance to buy crystal in the factory shop.

Following this, we will leave for Velehrad, and visit the famous St. Cyril and Methodius Basilica where the late Pope John Paul II celebrated mass in 1990. We will listen to the 5,000 pipe organ concert in the Velehrad cathedral. After lunch in a wine cellar, we'll visit Buchlovice Chateau and then return back to the hotel.

In the evening, we will leave for a typical Moravian wine cellar to enjoy live music, dinner and excellent Moravian wine.

Thursday, June 12

Today we will travel to Kromeriz, a historical city on the UNESCO protected list. We will tour the chateau built for the Archbishop in the 17th century with interior paintings by famous masters. Following that, we will enjoy wine tasting at Arcibuskupske Zamecke.

We will depart for Slusovice for crystal shopping and then back to the hotel for leisure time.

In the evening, we will be treated to dinner and dancing featuring the Veselanka band that has toured Texas many times.

Friday, June 13

In the morning, we will depart for Salzburg, Austria, stopping enroute for a guided walking tour of Vienna, the capital city of Austria, an imperial city for more than six centuries. We will take a drive through the 2 ½ mile Ringroad, constructed in 1857 and surrounded by the National Opera House, New town hall, National Theatre, Parliament, museums, universities, exclusive hotels and shops. If time allows, we will get off at Hofburg, the imperial palace where the Habsburg Dynasty resided until 1918. Within the palace, St. Augustine Church is where the hearts of the Habsburgs were deposited in the crypt and where all royal weddings took place. We will then continue our journey on to Salzburg, the home of the famous composer, W. A. Mozart. Check in at the hotel and dinner.

Saturday, June 14

We will start the day with a guided tour of Salzburg, where we will see the Mozart memorial on Mozart Square, Residenz Square, the fortress Hohensalzburg, and the film site of "The Sound of Music".

In the afternoon, we will depart for the Eagle's Nest situated just a few miles from Salzburg in Germany. It was given to Adolf Hitler for his 50th birthday. Very few of the original furnishings remain. There is now a restaurant there, but you can still view the original tea room with a fireplace made of Carrara marble – a gift from Mussolini. The view of the surrounding mountains with Salzburg in the background is unforgettable. We'll return back to the hotel for dinner.

Sunday, June 15

Depart for Innsbruck, a beautiful city surrounded by the Alps. We will stop enroute in Oberammergau, a small town where the famous Passion Play takes place every 10 years. The next one is in 2010. You can admire marvelous woodcarvings, impressive buildings, fascinating traditions and a neighborhood offering some of Bavaria's most famous castles and churches. Take a stroll in the town where you can shop for some of the best quality carved gifts and more.

Arrive in Innsbruck and check into the hotel. In the evening, we will be treated to the most requested show around called Tyrolean Evening, where dancers depict typical Tyrolean dances and songs.

Monday, June 16

Depart for Switzerland stopping enroute in Liechtenstein, the fourth smallest autonomous state in the world. It is one of the last monarchies. We will visit Vaduz, the capital, and the Vaduz castle, the residence of the Prince of Liechtenstein. We will continue on to Luzern. It is a town where the Reuss River resumes its flow. The identifying feature of Luzern is a 500 ft. long wooden covered bridge that crosses the river. We will check into the hotel and have dinner.

Tuesday, June 17

We will leave for the so-called "Golden Trip". The Golden Trip involves a ride by cable car to the top of the mountain Pilatus (5,000 ft. high), a ride down by the steepest railway in the world to Lake Lucerne, and a boat cruise back to Luzern. This is one of the most enjoyable and unforgettable trips. Leisure time in the afternoon in Luzern to shop, rest and pack your luggage for the return back home.

Wednesday, June 18

Depart to the Zurich airport early in the morning for our flight back to the USA!
